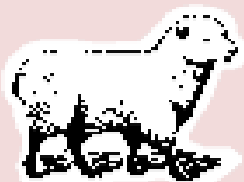

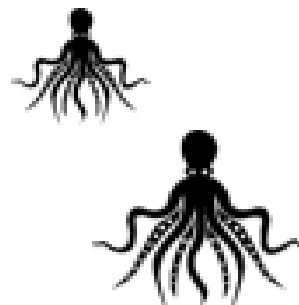

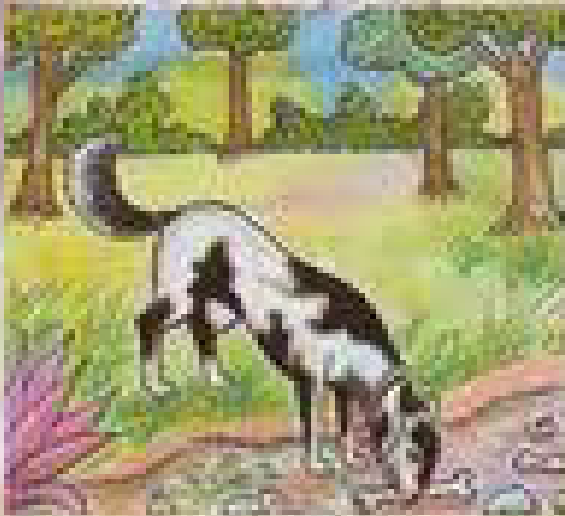

Story (The Greedy dog)

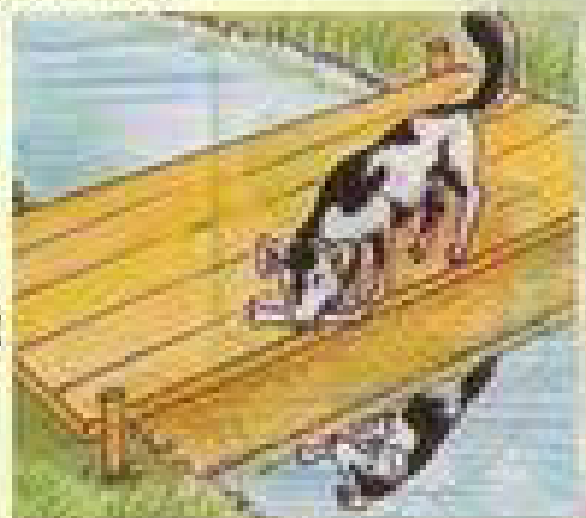
The Greedy dog
